It is open to all tenured or tenure track faculty at any of the Texas A&M University System components and is to be in recognition of an exceptional contribution to the faculty member's area of research in the past five years. Candidates should be leaders in their field and their discoveries/ research should have had a dramatic impact on their discipline(s). Award recipients will receive a \$10,000 cash award, a commemorative plaque, and will also have their name recorded on the JoAnn Treat commemorative glass vase displayed in the Research Foundation lobby. JoAnn Treat was made the first recipient of the award, upon her retirement in 2004.
