HURRICANES WREAK HAVOC ON COASTAL CAMELLIAS

The record-breaking 2005 hurricane season has had a terrible impact on our beloved camellias this year. Many of our CCS members will be seeing the effects of Hurricane Rita for several years.

Dennis and Renee Bilyeu lost power for several days following Rita, and since their water supply is from a well on their property, the loss in power meant they were unable to pump water. Besides being unable to bathe or cook or clean or flush toilets, the Bilyeus were unable to irrigate their camellias during the record-breaking heat that followed the storm. Dennis is hoping his camellias and orchard bounce back.

The experiences of Hyman Norsworthy, in Beaumont, and the Boudreauxs, in Port Neches, were even more devastating. Hyman wrote an e-mail note when he was finally able to return home:

"I left town the day before RITA hit, and went to my cousin's in Lufkin. I didn't get power back at home until the afternoon of October 12, and returned home that night.

While I was in Lufkin, I made arrangements to have the downed trees in my back yard removed. I have lost somewhere between 80 and 100 plants, crushed under the fallen trees. The plants on the east side just blew away and disappeared – I don't

know where they went.

Damage to the house was minimal —high winds blew the aluminum siding off the east gable. I will not rush for repair as the original house siding was underneath. You cannot imagine what this end of town

looks like. Many streets are blocked with fallen trees and power lines. Pass the word as I am up to my eyeballs in cleanup and trying to upright a bunch of plants that I think I can save. - Hyman Norsworthy"

Greg Davis was able to reach Lois and Dudley Boudreaux on October 17th and he wrote: "Dear Camellia Friends, I talked to Lois and Dudley today—they got phone service at 5 p.m. yesterday. Port Neches was almost wiped out by >100 MPH winds for 8 hours.

The Boudreauxs evacuated and came back to home on Oct. 4th. Four large oaks and one magnolia fell and smashed many of their camellias. One of the large oaks uprooted in their yard hit the kitchen corner of their home and did much damage. Tree limbs and trunks line all the streets of Port Neches and FEMA predicts it will take 3 months to clear away the debris.

Many camellia plants were blown down with roots exposed—now they have been without water for several weeks –and no way to get water to them. Some camellias

are OK but Dudley now says he wants to enter our < 100 plants Camellia Show!

Dudley and Lois are both doing as well as can be but the camellias are not. Best Wishes, Greg Davis"

All of us experienced power outages and wind damage of some sort. I have no doubt that the stories I have reported here are only a fraction of those to be told. Let's hope that with a little elbow grease and a little prayer we will be able to work together to overcome those obstacles that face us, and look forward to enjoying the beautiful camellia both now and in the future.

Dick Eidem will have some great camellias for sale, as well as a variety of other plants and supplies.


