GREETINGS, CAMELLIA LOVERS!

Thirty-three members were present at the January 4th meeting. W. B. Knox opened the meeting with prayer. President Linda McCraray thanked Beverly Roche for arranging the wonderful Christmas Party at the Bluebonnet and Rose.

Two questions came up during the Q&A session at the beginning of the meeting. Q: When is the best time to dig up and move a camellia? A: Between Feb. 1 and Mar. 1. Q: What can you do to get rid of scale during the winter? A: Treat leaves individually by cleaning with soap and water. Also, "Sunspray" oil can be used at any temperature and is available at most nursery supply houses.

CCS member and esteemed Camellia grower, Hyman Norsworthy, from Beaumont, Texas, talked about preparing your camellia blossoms for a show. He pointed out some of the characteristics of a blossom that judges particularly notice, and demonstrated the tools and processes used to correct minor flaws. He also discussed methods to help display blooms to their best advantage and explained the various ways to prepare your blooms so they will "keep" until show time. Hyman generously shared his own formula for the solution he uses to store his blooms: 1½ tsp. Crysel powder, 1¼ tsp. Floral Life powder, and 2 tsp. sugar dissolved in a quart of distilled water. Members expressed a lively interest in the program, especially those who planned to

enter some of their own flowers in the upcoming CCS Camellia Show.

Charlie Gambrill reported that preparations for the January show were on schedule. Charlie passed around a volunteer sheet for people

The weather was cool, but the sun finally came out for the 35th annual Coushatta Camellia Show, held at the First Christian Church on January 15-16. Thirty exhibitors (including 20 exhibiting in the CCS show) displayed 580 blooms to an attendance of over 350 people.

Nineteen judges were present, including Thomas Shelfer, Hal Vanis, Charles & Elizabeth Malone, and CCS members Doris* & Buffalo* Allwright, Dudley & Lois Boudreaux, Greg Davis, Charlie Gambrill, Ed Holland, W.B. Knox, Pat McMurrey, Hyman Norsworthy, Oscar Schank*, Milton & Claire Surles, Morris Waller*, Jackie Wells. (Novice judges marked with asterisk.)

Thanks to Marie Turner, we had new black tablecloths for the show this year. CCS member put together a delicious brunch on Saturday morning, after which the judging began. At 2 p.m., Judy Weidner gave a short presentation recognizing the wonderful participation by students in the Elementary School Camellia Participation Project. Second grade students in Armstrong, Geisinger, Sam Houston, Reaves, and B.B. Rice Elementary schools submitted their colored camellias for display and competition. Each school winner received a beautiful camellia tile painted by Diane Dyer, and 3 lucky children received a camellia plant. We were disappointed that there were not as many children attending this year, but we were very fortunate to have Dr. David Norton from the CISD participate in the program.
