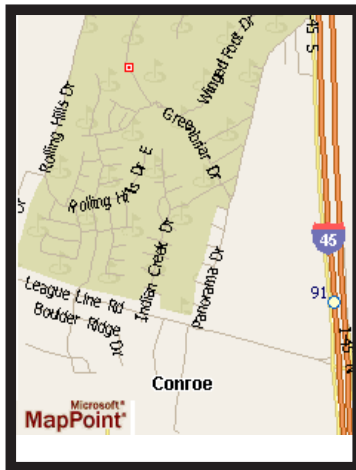
APRIL END-OF-THE-YEAR FEAST

CCS FIELD TRIP

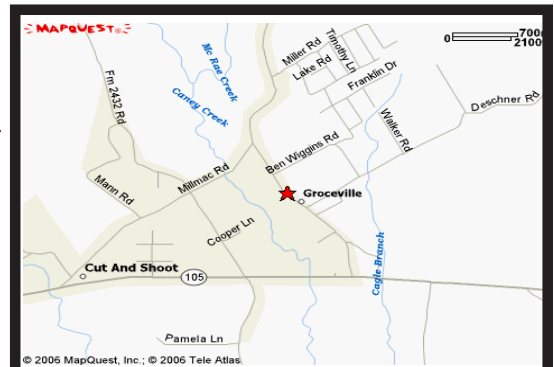

Members are asked to meet at 9:30 a.m. and to bring a sack lunch.

One of our speakers last year - Barbara Lopez - is the owner of Hope Farms and opens her gardens to the public, only on weekends, in May each year. This will be a private showing for CCS members, and will include an informational program.

Hope Farms is known for its 600 registered varieties of daylilies. If you spot one of Barbara's unusual daylilies that you'd like to purchase, she will just dig it up for you.
