Mary Gibson Hubbard

From The Courier, March 22, 2008 Mary Gibson Hubbard passed away gently in her sleep on March 18, 2009 after a very brief but serious illness. Born December 8, 1918 in Spring, TX to Blanche Holdner and James Henry, she attended San Jacinto High School and graduated from Rice University in 1939. She married James "Bo" Gibson on Feb. 15, 1940, and they lived in Argentina and Mexico until 1975. Bo and Mary retired to Panorama

Village and were one of the original homeowners on Wingedfoot Drive. Mary loved golf and gardening. A founder of Garden Clubs everywhere she lived, she was president of Panorama Garden Club from 1976-78. Mary and Bo were great philanthropists, endowing a chair at Rice University and at Texas A&M, where Bo graduated. She was a regular contributor to medical and handicapped charities and strongly supported the needs of education. Following Bo's death, Mary married a lifelong friend of hers, Ralph Hustace Hubbard, Jr. in 1990. Mary was a devoted member of the First United Methodist Church, which she attended every Sunday. She was also an active and strong participant and member of the Panorama Ladies Assoc., the 18-Hole Golf Club, the Coushatta Camellia Society, the Society of Rice University Women, the American Assoc. of University Women, Pan-American Round Table, Panorama Monday and Wednesday Bridge Clubs, The American Federation Garden Club and the Far Corners Garden Study Club. For Next Year

This season we learned a couple of things:

- Hold the Tour in the middle of February to avoid competing with early March events and to improve the likelihood of having more camellia blooms to see.
- We should have 4 volunteers, 3 minimum, at each house on the Garden Tour, and keep one volunteer at the table to encourage visitors to sign in, answer questions about membership, the CCS Calendar, The Cookbook, and anything else that comes up.
- In Walden and in Conroe, road signs directing our visitors were removed by city officials. We will need to find another method for guiding people to our locations (ribbons, balloons, or...?)
- Update the CCS Calendar.

- Have membership packets already set up with an application, "Why Join" information, and a map to our meeting location.
- We must have all positions filled on the Garden Tour Committee; there is just too much to do for someone to be working multiple assignments.
